2015 GCSE results - DfE performance tables

You may have read the recent *Salisbury Journal* article on the performance of secondary schools in south Wiltshire. The headline figure shown for The Stone-henge School was different to the record breaking 61% we reported last summer as having gained the benchmark five or more GCSE passes at grade C or above, including mathematics and English. This was probably the case for most of the schools named in the article. The discrepancy is due to a change in the data used by the DfE to compile their league tables. These tables now exclude any re-sits even if the student achieves a higher grade. It has never been the policy of this school to use early entry and re-sits to a large extent, cost being one factor. However some students who achieve a D in a key subject like English Language can often improve at their second attempt and this was the case in 2015. Confusingly, the league tables do not report the improved grade – only the original one.

FOUR REPRESENT SALISBURY AT WILTSHIRE SCHOOLS CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS



On Saturday 23rd January Byron Lloyd Gilmour, Will Haslam, Monty Podger and Finley Lloyd Gilmour represented Salisbury in the Wiltshire schools cross country championships.

The event had to be postponed a week earlier due to the course being flooded, however on the day of the event the course was in good condition and the weather was ideal.



The first of our runners to race was Byron Lloyd Gilmour in the Minor Boys (year 7) race. Byron had run well in the four Salisbury

races finishing in the top ten every race, however this was his toughest test so far racing against the best runners in Wiltshire. Byron finished a fantastic 10th place in a time of 10:04.

Well done to Byron who will now represent Wiltshire schools in the Southwest Championships to be



held at Pittville Park in Cheltenham on 06/02/16.

The next representative was Will Haslam in the Junior Boys (year 8/9) race. Will has been fantastic throughout the season with consistent top 5 finishes, like Byron it was time to test himself against the best in Wiltshire. Will ran a good race but just ran out of steam in the final kilometre, having been well placed, others finished really strongly leaving Will with a respectable 29th place finish in a time of 16:36.

The last race of the day was the Intermediate boys. We had Finley Lloyd Gilmour and Monty Podger battling for a top ten finish. Going into the race Monty had never beaten Finlay, but both runners were consistently in Salisbury's top ten in the local competition.

The race was a long and gruelling affair on a course that had cut up as the day progressed. The boys battled through a tough field and ended up finishing 14th and 17th in a close finish, surprisingly

Monty finished 14th in a time of 21:47 and Finley 17th in a time of 21.50. Both just missed out on County selection, but need recognition of their efforts this year.

Well done to all our runners who again are helping to put the name of The Stonehenge School on the National map. We would also like to wish Byron the very best of luck on the 6th February.

The team then took on a very good South Wilts side. They were made up of mostly year 8 players who played in the same tournament last year, and their experience showed. They managed to score 78 off their 8 overs, whereas we struggled and could only score 38.



The girls gained valuable match experience to go with their training sessions every Thursday, and we hope to get them some more fixtures in the near future.

The Boys took part in their qualifying tournament on Friday 5th February. The tournament was supposed to be a three team round robin, however due to Bishops not being able to make the dates set it was a straight knockout match against Trafalgar.

Stonehenge won the toss and decided to field first. The boys who had a mixture of year 7 and 8 boys, got off to a good start. With Alex Alcock the pick of the bowlers.

But then the Trafalgar batsmen found their form and started to hit the back wall gaining a few sixes in consecutive deliveries. Trafalgar set a large target of 81 which we knew was going to be difficult to chase, but openers Owen Earnshaw and Chester Willman battled well. Then four wickets fell in one over a collapse that saw the innings brought to an abrupt end on just 31 runs. We have to give credit to all of the Trafalgar bowlers who were fantastic, and by far the best our team have ever faced.

Both teams will now keep up their training on a Thursday after school and have a few more indoor matches before the outdoor season begins after Easter.
