The Stonehenge School rebuild / extension project - update.

Understandably the Local Authority's plans for the future of secondary education in Amesbury are of interest to the community. I'm aware there has been a good deal of speculation about the project, so the position so far is as follows :

Where will it be? No decision yet, as three sites - all in Amesbury - are under consideration. Two are owned by Wiltshire Council and the third owned by the MoD. Once a preferred site is identified planning permission will need to be sought via the normal channels. Naturally the local community will be able to contribute to this in the same manner as with all other planning applications.

How large is the budget ? Currently £6 $\frac{1}{2}$ to £7 million. The Local Authority may be able to increase this sum by selling some land and adding the revenue to the funding already allocated.

Extension or a total rebuild? In the long term a total rebuild is intended. Depending upon funding this may take place on a phased basis, so that an extension is built first as Phase 1 of a rebuild, with Phase 2 planned later.

When does it start? A project manager, quantity surveyors and architect team are already in post. Construction work is most likely to start in May 2017 to enable the new build to be ready for the start of term in September 2018.

A number of meetings are planned to resolve these issues and to make decisions on the future direction of the project. I will keep everyone informed via the Newsletter.

Our trip to Plas Pencelli



On our trip to Plas Pencelli, we stayed for five nights and did two activities each day. We were split up into two teams, the blue team and the green team (dream team). Every day we had breakfast, made our lunch for the activity and then came back for dinner, also we had hot chocolate before bed. The activities were around six hours, including the journey. The day was full of active work, which was a lot of exercise and we had to co-operate with our team, which was good because we met lots of new people. It was good to get away from home and technology, and to experience new things.

Climbing

We went climbing on Monday, some people were excited and some people were worried, but it was very funny

and we all co-operated and helped each other. First we had to get on the right clothes, which consisted of two layers on the bottom, four layers on top because it was very windy and cold, helmet, walking boots, harness and attached to a long rope. First Cat and Becks showed us how to climb and hold the ropes, and then we started climbing. Two people held the rope at the bottom. When we wanted to come down, we had to lean back and slowly walk down the rocks, it was very scary and hard, but everyone did it and tried their best. Once we had climbed for a few hours, we stopped to have lunch, and then moved onto some harder and higher rocks. Everyone tried the harder rocks, which was good. We were impressed and proud that we did it and didn't give up.

<u>Caving</u>

We went caving on Tuesday, Parisa was very scared but Natalia wasn't. We had to wear three bottom layers and three top layers, as well as caving suit, wellies, a helmet with a light on, gloves, knee pads and a belt. When we got there, we had to walk down



some steps to get to the cave entrance, which was a big arch shape. When we went into the cave it was dark, as we went deeper and deeper it got darker and darker, so we needed lights on. Also when we walked on rocks, it was really slippery and very wet, so we had to be careful. At first it was quite easy but later was difficult. A lot of people were scared but we also thought that was good fun. We went in some tight spaces but also spaces where we could stand up straight. Most of the time we had to crawl on all fours, that was good fun. By the end, everyone was very muddy and dirty. In one place in the cave we could go swimming but I thought that the water was too cold to swim. Two things which I liked were the slide and the tight spaces which we had to crawl and someone had to help you. I think that everyone who went into the cave with worried face, came out very impressed and happy. It taught us to work as a team.

<u>Canoeing</u>

On Wednesday we went canoeing at the River Wye, it was our favourite activity as it included team work and it was fun. We had to wear three layers on the bottom and top with waterproof, helmet, buoyancy aids and wellies. On the canoe we were in teams of three, we each had a paddle and had to row in order to move the canoe. We stopped for lunch and had a water fight which was really fun. We canoed over rapids and they were really fast. None of us fell in but some people jumped in.

Mountain Walk

On Thursday we went Mountain Walking, it was a very windy and cold day. We wore a couple of layers and





walking boots and we also brought waterproofs and a spare jumper in our rucksack, in case we got cold. Our instructor Joe told us a story

about a little boy named Tommy Jones who got lost on the Mountain. When we reached the top, we saw Tommy Jones' plaque, it was very interesting. The Mountain was very steep and high up. It was a good accomplishment, and we felt very proud once we were done.

Gorge Walk

The Gorge walk was the last activity we did before leaving. We had to wear many layers as well as waterproofs, helmets, belt and wellies as we were going to get very wet. First, we had to walk through a pitch black tunnel, holding onto the person in front of us. It was a scary experience. There was many lakes, and waterfalls that we went through and we even ate some edible plants that Joe showed us. The waterfall was very slippy and the bottom was a deep hole full of water. It was very fun, and we are happy we did it. Then we came back to the house and got changed, ready for our journey back to England.

Evening Activities

We did problem solving (we worked in three groups, with around seven people), orienteering (we had maps and had to find things), swimming (at a leisure centre, it had waterslides and vending machines), Walk (we did this on the first night so we could get to know the place better), and Dingle decent (this was our favourite, we were all blindfolded and attached to each other, we had to walk through a river

Dear Parents,

School uniform suppliers from September 2016.

To ensure greater consistency in the quality of the school's uniform and after consulting with parents, pupils and the Governing Body it has been agreed to formalise the choice of styles for skirts and trousers.

No change to the uniform itself is proposed. The blazer, tie and PE kit will continue to be available from school or online via Akuma, PMG or Kids Klobber (shop). There is no change to the policy on shoes (formal, black shoes only) nor to the requirement for the shirt / blouse to be white, with a formal collar.

However a wide range of different **skirts and trousers** are available from high street stores and far too many styles are not suitable for school. We have encountered trousers which are too tight, as well as skirts which are either too tight, too short or both. From September only specific styles of skirts or trousers will be acceptable and these will only be available via our above suppliers. **No other styles will be acceptable.**

We are grateful to parents for their continuing support in ensuring a consistently high standard of school uniform.
