HEADTEACHER'S NEWS

GCSE Exam Success - another Record Breaking Year!

Summer 2013 brought record breaking GCSE results. Students completing Year 11 broke the previous record set in 2011 with some outstanding achievements.

Overall almost 80% of students achieved 5 or more GCSE qualifications at grade C or better, the highest total achieved in the history of the school.

The proportion who achieved 5 or more GCSEs at grade C or better, including English and maths rose sharply to 57%; again the highest total achieved in the history of the school.

Students in both mathematics and English made better progress than the national average. In English three quarters of students made the expected '3 levels of progress' or better, and in mathematics the proportion was 72%.

Able, Gifted and Talented students achieved some outstanding individual performances and a quarter of students achieved at least 3 A* and A grades. Top student Jorge Carter achieved 9A* and 2 A grades, including an A* with distinction in Further Mathematics - the highest qualification possible at GCSE. Joshua Yates achieved 9 A grades, Lewis Whitehead and Amelia Capp 1A* and 7A grades each, Ben Whelan 4A* and 5A grades, Head Girl Charlotte Rowe scooped 2A* and 6A grades, Sophie Richardson 1A* and 6A grades, Joshua Price 2A* and 8A grades, Katie Newham 4A* and 6A grades and Douglas Bloom achieved 5A* and 5A grades.

Most subject areas celebrated an increase in pass rates and many also succeeded in achieving their achievement targets, including English Language, Mathematics, Art & Design, Business Studies, Catering, Classical Civilisation, Drama, Geography, German, Health & Social care, History, Information Technology, PE, Philosophy & Ethics, Spanish and Textiles.

MATHS REMINDERS

Building on the success of last year's early entry GCSE maths exam, we would like to remind parents that year 11 have their GCSE maths exam on 6^{th} November (Non- Calculator paper) and on the 8^{Th} November (Calculator paper).

It is vital, students take advantage of MYMaths and Mathswatch for revision (which should start NOW). Each student will have a login etc.. already allocated to them.

Two revision sessions will be held during school time: Monday 4^{th} November (Non calculator GCSE questions) and Thursday 7^{th} November (Calculator GCSE questions). The department has an open door policy so if a child is stuck on a topic, then he/she can ask any member of the maths team for help.

Finally, please ensure your child has a geometry set and a working Casio scientific calculator, well before the exam so that he/she is confident in using them.





No one will know you have registered and it will not affect any other benefits you are claiming.

Do you qualify?

You can register your child for Free School Meals if you get any of these benefits:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, provided they are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual income (as assessed by HM Revenue & Customs) that does not exceed £16,190
- Working Tax Credit 'run-on' the payment someone may receive for a further four weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
