How are we getting on with home learning at The Mead...?

In recent weeks, the children, teachers, TAs and families have all had to get to grips with a new way of teaching and learning. We are so proud of how the whole school community has embraced our virtual school and risen to the challenge!

We are using an online learning platform called Seesaw for all year groups from Nursery to Year Six. This is enabling staff to create an incredible range of learning activities for the children to access from home.

This has included our staff reading stories to children, maths learning, reading and writing, phonics videos, cross curricular activities and activities to focus on physical and mental wellbeing at this time. Our specialist Art, Music and PE staff have also been uploading activities and challenges for the children. Many children have also risen to the weekly challenge set by our Head of School.



Our year group teams have been working together to ensure that there is a range of learning activities for families to choose from. This includes continuing previous learning as well as introducing new concepts and topics across the curriculum. At The Mead, we pride ourselves in providing learning through experiences and while this is a strange and different time, the staff, children and families are ensuring that the activities provided are rich and worthwhile.

The response to this approach has been amazing and children have completed learning for our teachers and TAs to be able to see and respond to. It has been lovely for the children and staff to have this virtual interaction during this time.



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Bellefield Primary School, Trowbridge

At Bellefield, we have been busy setting home learning on 'Tapestry' for our youngest pupils and 'Seesaw' for the Year 1 children upwards. Children are very enthusiastic to learn at home and we are now delivering 30 minute online football sessions on 'Zoom' with Matt from Active Trowbridge.
