### **Residential fieldtrips**

We have conducted annual fieldtrips for the majority of the last 25 years. We were due to take students to Iceland in the autumn of 2020 until the coronavirus pandemic intervened. In previous years' we have run 4 residential trips to Southern Italy, and further trips based in Arundel, Great Yarmouth, Norwich, Colchester, Bakewell, Matlock, Brecon and the London Docklands.

#### Local and regional fieldwork

Day fieldwork was traditionally provided for all year groups and involved many trips to the New Forest, Barton on Sea, Hengistbury Head and even Bath. Compulsory fieldwork still exists for all year 9 -11 gcse Geographers. Recent trips have been to Portsmouth's Gunwharf Quays, the New Forest, Bourton on the Water and Swanage.

#### After school revision classes

From the spring term in year 11 gcse Geography students are asked to attend weekly after school revision in preparation for the gcse.

#### Literacy in Geography

All year 9 and 10 Geography students choose good subject related works of fact and fiction to read. We read geography related books at the start of year 9 lessons and test geographical language at the start of year 10 lessons.

Themes and styles also help keep your document coordinated. When you click Design and choose a new Theme, the pictures, charts, and SmartArt graphics change to match your new theme. When you apply styles, your headings change to match the new theme.
