






STONEHENGE SCHOOL

Science Club has been running from September after school and now takes place regularly every Wednesday from 3-4 pm. We have had up to 24 students stay and join in. We started off the year doing some Ecology and set up pitfall traps, made a wormery, and caught flying insects. We have also made crystal snowflakes, turned coins golden, made glass coloured beads, and investigated types of sugar. We were lucky enough to make honeycomb down in Food and Technology and some tasted better than others. More recently we have made water mills, windmills, and model Archimedes screws. PERSONALISED PIZZA

Customise this basic pizza however you like!

SERVING

1	INGREDIENTS:
•	150g FLOUR
	1/2 ten SALT

- 1/2 tsp SALT
- 4g FAST ACTION YEAST
- 100ml WARM WATER
- 1 tbsp OLIVE OIL
- TOMATO SAUCE/PASSATA
- GRATED CHEESE/MOZZARELLA
- YOUR CHOICE OF TOPPINGS

PROCEDURE:

PREHEAT THE OVEN TO 220°C

- **2** PUT THE FLOUR INTO A LARGE BOWL AND THEN STIR IN THE YEAST, SALT AND ANY HERBS OF YOUR CHOICE (I LIKE TO PUT ¼ TEASPOON OF GARLIC AND ONION POWDER)
- CREATE A WELL IN THE MIDDLE OF THE FLOUR
- **4** POUR IN THE WARM WATER AND OLIVE OIL
- 5 STIR GENTLY UNTIL THE WATER IS COMBINED THEN TIP OUT ONTO A LIGHTLY FLOURED SURFACE
- **WINDER OF A STRETCH THE DOUGH FOR A FEW MINUTES UNTIL IT IS SMOOTH**
- FLOUR A ROLLING PIN AND YOUR WORK SURFACE
- 8 ROLL OUT INTO A CIRCLE, PLACE ONTO A BAKING TRAY AND PART COOK FOR 5-7 MINUTES
- ADD SOME TOMATO SAUCE/ PASATTA TO YOUR BASE AND THEN ARRANGE YOUR TOPPINGS (CHEESE FIRST)
- PLACE BACK INTO THE OVEN FOR 8 MINUTES




