Headteacher's message

This week there have been a number of events in school that should be celebrated, more details around each one to follow.

We are still awaiting to find out the outcomes of the planning permission on Holder's field but have started to explore the facilities that we are planning to create for the PE curriculum, and looking at the equipment that may be needed. We clearly have a great deal of sporting talent in our school, and now need to ensure that they have the ability to practice even more.

One of our key areas for improvement this year is to improve punctuality. This week we have been closing the gates at exactly 8:35am so that anybody who is late needs to sign in at reception which will trigger time to be spent after school with the senior leadership team. Since our lessons start at 8:40am some children are coming in so late that they are actually missing learning time.

We have also continued our focus on attendance, which is now in line with the National average. You'll have spotted that Ofsted said the policies that we are putting into place to improve this are making an impact. One of our ways to support you and your child with this is to ensure you have up-to-date information about their attendance so that it can be monitored and tracked, via Class Charts and via letters sent home. Year 11 attendance is the key priority as expressed in letters received by all Year 11 parents recently.
