The team, sponsored by Stonehenge Plumbing and Heating, started slowly with St Joseph's Catholic College (STJCC) dominating play with a big 3 pointer and quick basket to start their account with a stunned home crowd. After a Warriors time out, they responded with the calm nerves of Henry Sui hitting 4 points and then Kane Mia Ria to take the Warriors into the lead. So a very scrappy first quarter with the Warriors just on top at 6-5.

In the second quarter (after some stern words from the Warriors Coach at the break), the Warriors increased their work rate on their defence and moved the ball faster up the court with Joseph Vuki stealing the ball and scoring then Joseph Flynn dominating rebounds at both ends and scoring. At the end of the 3rd quarter the Warriors led 28-17.

The 4th quarter was a totally different affair with the Warriors shifting up a gear and taking advantage of the visitors tiring and went on a 11-0 rampage including an enormous 3 point from Henry Sui to send the home supporters wild. When the final buzzer went, the Stonehenge School Warriors had won 39-21.

CANCER SUPPORT SALISBURY





Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
