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THE STONEHENGE WARRIORS (U15 BOYS)

The Stonehenge Warriors (U15 Boys) travelled to a basketball tournament on Thursday 10th March 2023 at Bishop Wordsworth in Salisbury. The Warriors came into the tournament having not played many matches for some time (since 6/02) and a little rusty with recent snow closures, parents evenings and strike disruptions. We also had 5 games of 12 minutes which was an unusual format over 4.5 hours.

Our first game was against Bishop Wordsworth who were a really good side playing in National League Competitions. Henry Sui and Joseph Flynn led the scoring in a one-sided affair losing 19-4. Great effort and defence from the boys but we looked very "rusty" in offence and they turned our ball over too many times punishing us with nice plays. Next up was our main target to beat, Trafalgar School, trying to take revenge after the recent loss at home. We dominated the first 6 minutes of play with us outplaying them but failing to finish. Maks Kovalenko was so unlucky dominating offence but each of the 4 shots he took (that he would have got in at training) failed to go in! Henry Sui dominated play leading the scoring with a 4 basket run, Joseph Flynn got into the action with an important basket but Trafalgar fought back to make it 10-8 to the Warriors with 20 seconds left. A great play the Trafalgar School led them to bitting a massive 3 pointer after our poor defence to sink the Warriors to a 11-10 loss. A very unhappy Warriors Team but a great game.

Looking for a win the Warriors faced up to St Johns Marlborough. Coach Carter fired the Warriors up. Out of the blocks the Warriors raced to a 10-7 win with Joseph Vuki and Joseph Flyon dominating play and showing excellent form. Phew! Up next were a new look St Joseph's school team with their new kit and playing really well in the tournament as a whole. However, this probably was our best team effort with the ball being passed quickly, great rebounding and defence dominance. 11-2 it ended to the Warriors with Joseph Flynn and Benek Loftus scoring well, Maks Kovalenko scoring a nice basket and Henry Sui getting a brace. Much better!!!

The final game came at 5.00pm with a cold and tired Warriors playing St Edmunds. I was very confident in a win and we on paper were the better team coming off two straight wins. Let's not talk about that game. It was a bit like the Manchester United vs Liverpool game a week or so back. One team did not turn up at all and that was us. One to delete from memory!

All in all a good first tournament in a strange format but useful learning for myself and the Warriors. Friends made while waiting for our games and the boys were really well behaved plus a credit to the school. Polite to each other, polite to the referees and shook the hands of all players at the end of each game whether we won or lost.
