A message from the Headteacher

As we approach the warmer weather we would again like to remind you to send your children in with a drink. We have water refill stations around school so they should never be without. However we have noticed a trend for students to bring in water pistols which for obvious reasons are a banned item within school. As we are ever vigilant we ask that you help us by ensuring only bottles of water are brought into school.

In addition, the warmer weather does not mean a change in uniform and we would ask that parents ensure students are still in their correct uniform coming to school. Any changes will be sent out via our Schoolcomms system.

As a continuation of explaining our improvement priorities for the next academic year, the second section of our Improvement plan relates to the Quality of Education that we aim to provide the pupils of our school. The specific areas that we will be developing next year will be:

- Develop confidence in implementing suitable strategies that provide opportunities for regular structured talk (oracy)

- Embed systematic assessment that is suitably sequenced, timely and informs responsive teaching

- And develop the use of DIRT (Directed Improvement and Reflection Time), Knowledge organisers and retrieval practice.

This means that we want to target methods within our teaching that ensure pupils are developing their literacy skills and vocabulary through developing their verbal skills, and that we want to ensure that assessment opportunities are clear, and that feedback allows pupils to use the information to make clear progress and improvements. We also want to support pupils in being able to remember key information as they study the curriculum, and practice methods for revising in preparations for exams.

Thank you to all of the parents who responded regarding the behaviour survey. It is important that the whole of our school community works together towards ensuring the ethos of the school is right, and make the behaviour of the school, even better than the description given by Ofsted earlier this academic year. We will update you on the Behaviour Hubs programme as we progress through it.
