Headteacher's message

Dear Parents and Carers,

The National Education Union have recently announced additional strike days to be held this academic year. This follows the decision of many teaching unions to reject the pay offer from the Department for Education earlier this year, based on the grounds that any pay increase will not be funded by central government but will be placed on schools to fund from existing budgets. This clearly places an additional strain onto schools, at a time when budgets will have been planned to support the education of the pupils as much as possible.

The two new dates announced are Wednesday 5th July and Friday 7th July.

We have a very high number of staff members in the relevant Union, meaning that it is not possible to staff the school fully. The 5th July is also calendared to be our Year 6 into 7 transition day to support the new pupils who are due to start their Secondary education. After careful consideration of the information currently available to us and a risk assessment of health and safety and safeguarding factors, we have made the decision that on:

• Wednesday 5th July - school to be closed to Years 7, 8, 9 and 10 - Year 6 into 7 transition to continue as planned

• Friday 7th July - school to be closed to Years 7, 8 and 9 - open to Year 10 only.

School will be open to the following students on both days:

If you are in receipt of Free school meals and your child is in a year group remaining at home we will write to you seperately with a form to complete to request food in advance.

If your child is attending school due to being in one of the above categories, a range of food and snacks will be available to be purchased from the canteen at both break and lunch, alternatively students can bring their own packed lunches.

Due to teachers striking, they will not be in a position to lead remote learning sessions, therefore, students at home are asked to consolidate their work and ensure they are up to date with all homework.

If members of staff are not striking, they will organise additional learning through ClassCharts. Therefore, all students are also asked to check the system to see if further work has been set.

Whilst we are aware the strike action taken is not against the school we are very sorry for the disruption this will cause you.

Finally, can I take this opportunity to thank you for your understanding.

During the morning I participated in several activities such as printing, making sand mandalas, learning some of the Tibetan language and more! All of the activities we took part in all have special places in their practices and culture, so it was amazing to have the opportunity to try them out.

On top of this, we were invited to a performance in the afternoon where the Monks performed prayers, dances, musical instruments and debates. We were also taught different Mudras which are hand signs that are frequently performed in their prayers. They did chants for us and put on outfits that are used during Buddhist festivals.

We learnt lots of new information about how they go about their everyday lives, and we were given the opportunity to see the world from their perspective.

All of the Monks were very kind, encouraging and open to any questions we had. They showed us different skills with different tools. The Monks had a good sense of humour and made lots of us laugh and smile.
