HELLO,

Last night's Open Evening was a really lovely occasion. The school was full of prospective new parents looking at the school with their year 6s and 5s in mind. The school was buzzing with activity across the site, with pupils dancing, singing, playing music, cooking, completing science and engineering practicals, rehearsing Matilda and our prefect team helping to direct parents throughout the school. Obviously our new building gained a lot of attraction, and many compliments. Head boy and Head girl joined myself in two presentations, explaining our ethos, curriculum and range of support that we provide our students.

I have been working with English Heritage as part of an advisory panel supporting the development of plans for a new dedicated Learning Centre that would allow expansion of the education programme at the site. Plans for the Stonehenge Learning Centre have recently been unveiled and include a STEM learning lab and Neolithic Classroom.

In July, a group of our pupils were invited to take part in pilot sessions for the new STEM Learning Centre, and the school is continuing to work closely with the monuments education team as the plans unfold.

Developments at Holder's Road are continuing, with large amounts of equipment still to be assembled and placed up there in order to invest fully in our Sports curriculum. Here you can see how the site is starting to transform, with one of many football pitches now in place. Rugby posts are due to be erected soon too, which I know will delight the pupils as many are keen to play rugby on a proper field at our school.

A polite reminder that we have returned to full uniform, therefore we expect pupils to have their ties and blazers every day. Jumpers should only ever be worn as an additional layer, under blazers. All pupils should be in shoes, unless adjustments have been agreed based on medical advice.
