


As with any new process, it will take time to embed itself, but we appreciate your continued support in ensuring our clubs run as smoothly as possible.

We will be serving Christmas Lunch in the main school canteen and spaces are limited. We must ask that you make payment on ParentPay no later than Friday 24th November 2023.


