

#### **MEASLES**

Nationally we are seeing an increase in <u>measles</u>. It is a highly infectious disease which can lead to serious health problems in some people, with 1 in 15 children with measles suffering serious complications such as meningitis and sepsis. Symptoms include a high fever, sore red watery eyes and a blotchy red-brown rash, and it is particularly easy to catch in environments when in close contact with others. Children who are not up to date with their MMR vaccinations are at risk of catching measles in their classroom from an infected classmate.

The MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) vaccine is the safest and most effective way to protect against measles. People need two doses of MMR to be protected. View further information on the <u>NHS vaccination schedule</u>.
