Message from the Headteacher ...

A couple of weeks ago, I mentioned that we were having a review conducted by the Local Authority. One of the areas that was focused on was behaviour across the school, and the different aspects to our provision that we have in place. It is a delight to share some of the key areas of feedback from the report, which stated the following:

- · Students' behaviour both in and out of lessons is positive and respectful.
- · Prefects carry out their break and lunch duties responsibly
- \cdot The implementation of Bold Voices across the school is allowing students to reflect on their use of language, what is appropriate to say to others, and the dangers of 'banter'

• Students who have been educated within our Redworth Alternative curriculum Centre recognise its effectiveness in helping them stay in school

- The Student Parliament are very proud of their role and their school
- \cdot The Reset room has a positive feel and is well-staffed
- The LEARN acronym is clear and well understood by pupils
- \cdot Attendance monitoring and incentives are effective

• Students speak about the relational approach that the staff body exudes. It is important to remember that all of these positive aspects are based on the hard work and partnership between the school and parents. What is always noticeable is the support that we receive from the vast majority of our parents, and what a credit our pupils are.

Reminder of Home-school communication policy

At various intervals, it becomes necessary to remind parents of our home-school communications policy. It is really important that we strike the right balance between keeping parents up-to-date, answering queries and responding to important issues, with the fact that staff time is generally dedicated to being child-facing and working with the pupils themselves. Whilst we endeavour to respond to all communications, it often isn't possible to meet demand especially in the day and age of high levels of email traffic.

A key quote to draw your attention to is:

The school's primary function is to provide a high-quality education to the pupils of The Stonehenge School. Its resources, and therefore staff time is heavily focused on this moral purpose, and it is important that means of communication supports this. Staffing is a finite resource and therefore the school needs to strike a clear balance in order to ensure the progress made by pupils is maximised, and that the most effective means of communication is utilised.


