

The students who joined us to McDonald's for lunch represented the school beautifully and have been awarded for doing so.


Perhaps in the next Attendance World Cup, a Sarum team can win again and make it the third victory in a row!




Are you planning on having a clear out over the Easter break? We would love to take on any Lego that may not be wanted anymore!

| Chickenpox | at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over |
|---|---|
| Diarrhoea and Vomiting | 48 hours after their last episode |
| Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19) | they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19 |
| Impetigo | Their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics |
| Measles | 4 days after the rash first appeared |
| Mumps | 5 days after the swelling started they've had their first treatment |
| Scabies | 24 hours after they started taking antibiotics |
| Scarlet Fever | 48 hours after they started taking antibiotics |
