This week we welcomed our new Year 7 into the school for a whole day with us as part of their induction ready for September. They met myself and Mr Randall in the morning for an assembly to talk them through the day, what types of lessons and experiences they can look forward to enjoying with us, and some of the key information that they needed before they start with us. They all appeared to have a lovely first day with us as there were lots of smiley faces from them and their parents when they came back in the evening for the Induction Evening. During this time all parents had a session with myself and Mr Randall, the opportunity to ask questions from a range of staff, and a chance to meet their new tutors who will be the first port of contact over the next 5 years.

Year 10 are gearing themselves up to enter the world of work next week as they head out onto Work Experience. Most of them have organised themselves well and found a worthwhile placement. They also had the chance to visit Andover College on Thursday where they were able to explore the range of courses that are available in order to start making decisions about post-16 courses. This all falls under our aim to help our pupils have high aspirations and unlock their potential so that they prepare for successful futures.

Over the summer lots of work will be completed again across the school site as we continue our work to create an environment that the children can be proud of and further enhance our state of the art facilities. This is going to include a very stylish new library, improved toilet facilities in the middle part of our school, and an improved reception environment that further increases the safeguarding of our students. 
Falconry Display - Archer House Reward

As a reward for the winning house of term 5, Archer were treated to a Falconry Display on Holders field organised by Miss Bowen and Miss Rackham. It was a fantastic display, the students were introduced to a range of birds of prey including a Hawk, an Owl and a Kestrel. The Kestrel went soaring off in to the distance and many thought he had gone missing, after 5 minutes of waiting with baited breath for his return, he came flying back to his owner! On Tuesday, members of Archer walked up to Holder's Field to watch a Falconry Display. The falconer that ran it showed us some spectacular birds, which consisted of falcons- of which included the fastest animal: the peregrine falconalongside a massive owl. Some of these majestic birds were released and allowed to fly above the area in which we sat, one at a time, soaring in the area around us. The falconer would stand behind us, allowing a falcon to swiftly glide towards us, drawing nearer and nearer until it darted over our heads and landed onto his hand. Overall, it was an interesting and enjoyable experience that allowed us to learn more about falconry and birds in general. – Charlie Pearson, Y10, Archer House


Stonehenge Elections

Over the past couple of weeks our school parliament has been gearing-up for The Stonehenge School general election. This has allowed us to develop the pupils' understanding of Democracy, which is one of the British Values which should be part of their curriculum and education. The parliamentary cabinet, consisting of eight senior parliamentarians, represented the country's five major parties: Conservative, Labour, Liberal Democrats, Green and Reform UK.

They had to design a campaign poster, canvass support and prepare for a TV style debate, which took place on Tuesday. In this debate, the candidates had to state their views on education, climate change and the NHS. They were challenged by other members of parliament, who made up the audience, as well as by each other! The highlights of this debate were shared with the school before polling opened.

On Wednesday 3rd July and Thursday 4th July, all students in the school were given the opportunity to cast their vote when the canteen was turned into The Stonehenge School polling station.

This experience has definitely generated discussion and debate, and has certainly allowed students to participate in a major national event.

FUEL Programme

FUEL is the holiday activity and food programme (HAF) that is funded by the Department of Education. FUEL provides eligible school-aged children with free access to enriching activities, nutritious meals and healthy eating information during the Easter, Summer and Christmas holidays.

The HAF programme is delivered in Wiltshire using the brand FUEL (Food, Unity, Energy, Laughter) and the programme is a direct response to the growing issue of holiday hunger.

Who is eligible for the FUEL Programme?

The FUEL Programme a bespoke provision for school aged children from reception to year 11 who receive benefit-related free school meals.

Benefits-related free school meals (FSM) are available to pupils if their parents are in receipt of one of the qualifying benefits, and have a claim verified by their school or local authority.

Further information on eligibility for Free school meals.

The FUEL Programme is also available to children that meet any of the below:

- children that are refugees
- children that are currently in the care system
- young carers
- children that are referred into the programme by a professional service (eg. Local authority, schools, social service) For further enquiries, please email fuelprogramme@wiltshire.gov.uk(opens new window).

FAQs

How do I know if my child is eligible for FUEL activities?

Information about eligibility can be found on the FUEL Programme web page.

My child has Free School Meals in school because they are in Reception Class or a KS1 Class. Are they eligible for FUEL?

No. Your child is only eligible for FUEL if they would be entitled to benefit related Free School Meals. Information about eligibility is on the FUEL Programme web page.

Do I have to sign my child up for every day of the activity programme?

No, you can sign your child up fo<mark>r as many o</mark>r as few days as you would like for them to attend.

My child has food allergies and/or other dietary requirements; how are these catered for?

Please make sure that you highlight any of these when you complete your child's details. Our food provider can cater for food allergies and intolerances. The information about dietary requirements will be shared with them and activity providers.

I have changed my mind about the activities and dates I have selected for my child; how do I let activity providers know?

You can alter your bookings on the FUEL booking page. Wiltshire Council will pass that information on to activity providers.

My child's medical information details have changed since I set up my account and made bookings; how do I make changes to these?

You can make changes in the FUEL booking system. Any changes you make will be passed to food and activity providers as appropriate.

I booked a place for my child some time ago but it is showing as 'requested', what does that mean?

It means that the information is still being checked and has not been passed to the activity provider for follow up. The space is still reserved in our system.

Can I book more than one activity per day?

You can only book one activity per day per child.

I am trying to book activities for my child but I cannot see their name when I go into an activity, why is that?

If your child's name does not appear, then it is probably because you have made changes to their details. You need to access the child's details via the Summary page and re-confirm their details.

I have tried to book my child on to an activity but the ones I am interested are now full. Can I be added to a waiting list?

You can express an interest in an activity that is fully booked, using the booking system. We will contact you if a space becomes available. Please do still book spaces on alternative activities if they are available.
