### Headteacher's message ...

We are excited to share that we've received our first round of applications for the upcoming academic year starting in September. We are thrilled to see that 210 families have chosen The Stonehenge School as their first preference, with an additional 91 selecting us as their second choice, and 21 as their third. This strong interest reflects the trust and confidence you place in our school's ability to provide an exceptional educational experience for your children. We are committed to upholding the standards and values that make The Stonehenge School a top choice for so many families and look forward to welcoming new students into our community.



I am excited to share some updates regarding our curriculum and teaching strategies at The Stonehenge School. We are embarking on an important journey to enhance our support for students in the classroom through an adaptive teaching approach. This initiative, part of our Quality First INCLUSIVE teaching priority, aims to cater to the varying needs of all pupils. Inspired by successful practices observed at other schools, and driven by a research-led approach, we will be focusing on comprehensive training for our staff, including the development of teaching assistants. Our strategies emphasise effective oracy and assessment for learning, ensuring that every student can access the curriculum and thrive academically. We believe these developments will greatly benefit our students by fostering a more inclusive and supportive learning environment.

We would like to inform parents and students that Wiltshire Police are currently working with staff at the CO-OP on Boscombe Road, Amesbury, SP4 7JH, in response to ongoing incidents of shoplifting. While some persistent offenders are adults, it has come to light that a small number of Stonehenge School students have also been involved after school hours. Shoplifting has a significant impact on local businesses, resulting in financial losses and placing a burden on our community.



As a reminder, our school's behaviour policy includes the ability to apply sanctions for behaviours outside of school when they affect the community's welfare and safety. We will always work in partnership with the police to support any necessary identification of individuals involved. The Neighbourhood Policing Team is aware of the issue and is conducting regular patrols. Please be aware that any students caught in school uniform on CCTV may be visited by officers during school hours to discuss the matter.

A heartfelt thank you to Miss Harris and Mr Rogers for leading this week's Remembrance assembly and two-minutes silence in school on Monday. We were also deeply moved by the positive feedback received about our students' participation in Sunday's town parade, including the Head Boy and Head Girl's reading of the names of the fallen. This year, we invited pupils to wear their cadets, scout/guides, or Girls' Brigade uniforms to school, and they wore them with great pride. In the afternoon, I had the pleasure of watching them perform drills around the tennis courts, which was a truly memorable sight. We will keep this as a feature moving forward, and we would also be open to ways that we can include more of the services community moving forward each year.

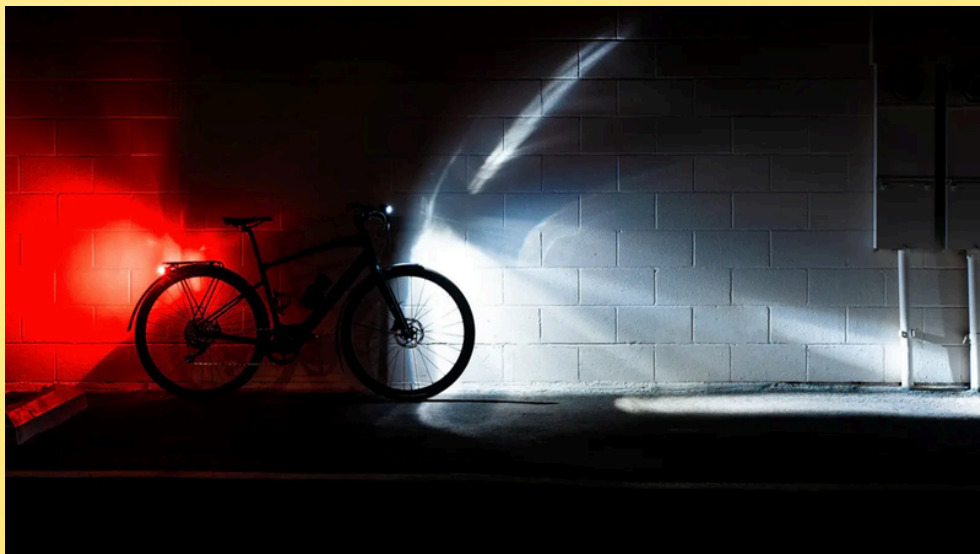
