FSM STUDENTS INCREASE IN DAILY ALLOWANCE

Starting from 1st April 2025, the daily allowance for students entitled to free school meals will incr

ease from £2.50 to £2.60. The £2.60 will be automatically added to the student's account each day, and any unused funds will not carry over.

Parents of students who receive free school meals may also choose to add additional funds to their child's account if they wish to purchase extra food beyond the £2.60 allowance.

Drinking water is freely available at social time, in various parts of the school.


🚰 Stay Hydrated the Right Way! 🚰

Toilet sinks use a TMV system, which mixes hot and cold water from the




Where to Find Water Fountains:
