

Salter's Institute Chemistry Festival

Last Thursday ten year 10 students travelled to the University of Bath with Mrs Moran and I to take part in the Salter's Institute Chemistry Festival.

The pupils began the day in the lecture theatre with an introduction to the synthesis of organic compounds which linked nicely into a 3 hour lab session where they synthesised Aspirin – an activity usually performed at A-Level. This hands-on session in first-class lab facilities was broken up by a lunch break in the sun next to the lake in the middle of the campus. An eye-opener to university life – it certainly was a change to lunch in the school canteen – but at least we don't have to contend with greedy, low flying ducks! After the lab session, the pupils had the opportunity to listen to the career paths of chemists in various fields such as a patent lawyer and a research and development chemist before having the chance to ask questions.


The day was a great success and gave everyone a valuable insight into what it would be like to study degree-level chemistry.

Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Qualifying Expedition



On Saturday 10th and Sunday 11th May, a group of 38 Year 9 students completed the Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Qualifying Expedition in the New Forest. Thankfully we had a weekend full of sunshine which certainly made the walking more enjoyable. Students set off on Saturday at 9am and all made it to the campsite, over 15km away, in one piece – although a few had taken a slight detour through a bog on the way! All students cooked their own food (one even made his own flatbreads on a camping stove!) and had a well-deserved rest before turning in for the night. Shockingly, most of the students woke up at 05:45am, so we had a lot of bleary eyes on Sunday morning, mainly from the staff. After breakfast, students packed up and set off through more wonderful sunshine, walking another 15km to the end point, with a few more dips in a bog on the way.

Every single student improved massively from our Practice Expedition just two weeks previously, and it was fantastic to see so many students willing to get out of their comfort zone and really challenge themselves. Well done to everyone involved!


