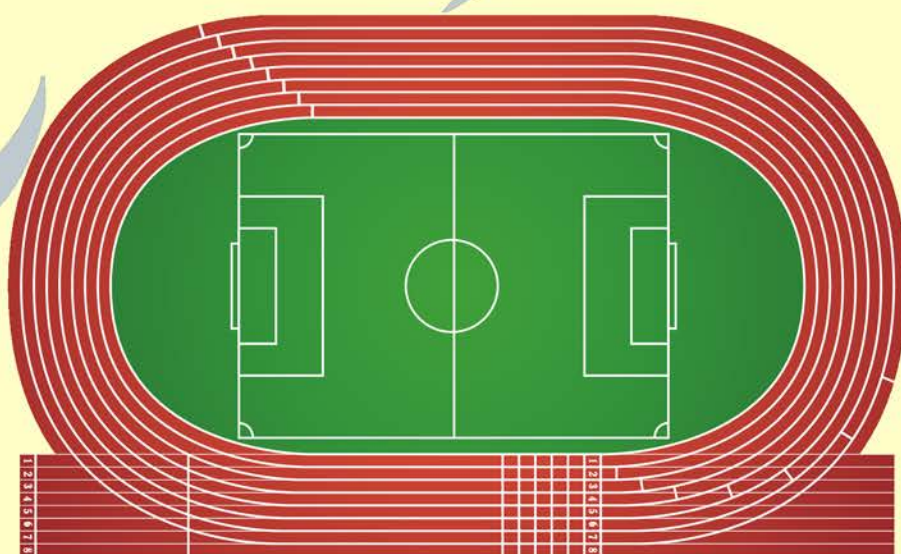

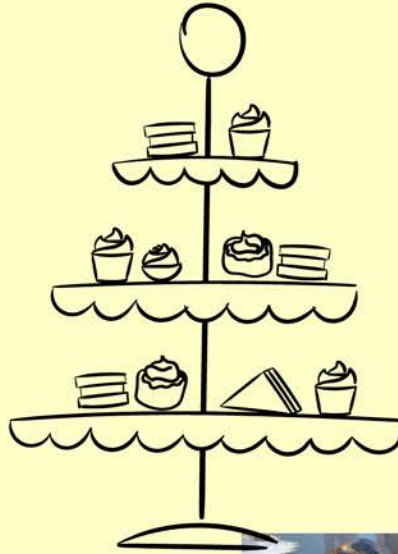

Have you ever wondered how technology is transforming how we manage money? Or why cybersecurity is so important in protecting our finances? Check out this [40 minute video from Tech She Can](#) in collaboration with Deutsche Bank. Lots of universities run Year 12 summer schools. Many also offer Year 10 versions too! They provide you with the opportunity to learn more about the benefits of higher education, see what university facilities are like (including student halls - where you could live!) and take part in taster lectures. Here is a list of different options currently available to apply to. If there is a particular university you're interested in, you could also search the name of the university followed by "summer school" to find their opportunities. On the UCAS hub, you'll find lots of live sessions with employers, careers advisors and university staff. They cover topics such as "Should I use AI to write my personal statement?", "Weighing up your options: Uni? Apprenticeship? Gap Year?" and "How to find the perfect course for you".
