This year we have again, had the opportunity to work with the Jon Egging Trust. We have 25 students from years 8 and 9 enrolled on their Blue Skies Programme. Wiltshire Council – Local Offer - Supporting My Neurodivergent Young Person (SMNYP)

SMNYP is designed to help parent/carers develop a better understanding of their child or young person who may have any or all of the following: inflexible thinking, differences in communication and social interaction, sensory differences and difficulty maintaining attention and focus or following the adult's agenda.

The focus of Supporting My Neurodivergent Young Person is to understand the reasons which may lead to certain behaviours or responses and practical strategies to try. The course content is designed primarily for young people who are in mainstream schools and/or use or are developing verbal communication.

Sessions cover key areas such as understanding neurodivergence, communication and social interaction, developing attention, sensory differences and behaviour.

The young person may be on the Needs Led Profiling Tool or awaiting investigation of possible autism and/or ADHD on the Neurodevelopmental Pathway.

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If your child has had a dyslexia screener in school and they have a result of severely or moderately dyslexic tendencies you maybe concerned about the next steps after The Stonehenge School. As a needs led school we do not need an official dyslexia diagnosis to put interventions and support in place depending on your child's needs. This is also the case at college. The need for a diagnosis comes if they go to university and even then, there are some universities that do the testing using Disabled Living Allowance funding. The British Dyslexia Association recognise that for some families the cost of this is beyond their financial means and because of this they have a bursary available to low income families. Here is the announcement from them:

The British Dyslexia Association is delighted to inform you that we are offering funded dyslexia assessment bursaries to 12-21-year-olds from low-income households. Thanks to our partnership with Theo Paphitis and Ryman, these bursaries aim to significantly reduce financial barriers to obtaining a diagnostic dyslexia assessment, which can typically cost between £500 and £800. For eligible applicants, the assessment will be provided remotely via a secure video platform such as Zoom.

While the majority of the cost is funded, a minimum contribution of £75 is required from successful applicants at the time of booking the assessment.

For those applicants who may not be successful in this phase, we will create a waitlist and will notify them when the next round of bursaries is released.
