
Message from the Headteacher...

#### **Author Visit - Matt Dickinson**

We were delighted to welcome Matt Dickinson, author of The Everest Files, to work with Year 8. He began with a whole-year presentation that explored the life-changing



Later in the day, Matt ran creative writing workshops. Pupils imagined what they would miss most if they spent two months on Everest, and then turned to non-fiction writing, choosing jobs they might take on in an expedition - from base camp cook to yak herder. The pupils were fully engaged and produced some excellent pieces of work. The Everest Files is now available in the school library for those who would like to continue the adventure through Matt's writing.







#### Important Notice: Vehicle Access Restrictions - Effective from Monday 15th September

As part of our continued commitment to safeguarding and ensuring the health and safety of all our students, we will be introducing new vehicle access restrictions from Monday 15th September.

To reduce traffic on site and to keep students safely separated from vehicles, the vehicle gates at the Holders Road end of the school site (near the Sports Centre) will remain locked. This change is being made due to increasing traffic and the associated risks to student safety.

#### Key points for parents and carers:

- The vehicle gates at the Holders Road end of the site will remain locked.
- The Antrobus Road entrance will remain open for pedestrian and staff vehicle access only.
- If you drive onto site to drop off your child, you will be unable to exit via the Holders Road gates once
  they are locked, causing delays or requiring you to reverse or turn around, which creates a serious
  safety risk.
- Please do not drive onto the school site to drop off or collect children at any time. Instead, we ask that you use nearby locations such as Tesco or B&M car parks, which offer safer alternatives and reduce congestion around the school.
- Please respect all 'No Entry' signs. The school operates a one-way traffic system, and the car park is for staff use only.

We thank you for your understanding and cooperation in helping us maintain a safe environment for all students and staff
