It has been agreed to run a secret SEN campout for two days in August 2026. It includes evening entertainment and the daytime activities for the children. There is more information on the website soon about all the activities, but this is the link to book a camping pitch and if the parents want to, they can also book glamping tents via the site. This will be two days where families can relax go off grid and let their children be their wonderful selves without judgement or fear. The site is very basic but its one of my personal favourite places to go, there are lots of local places to visit as well and a wonder river near by where children and adults can play and woods to explore. There is no electric or internet on site.

Online Safety Concern - Important Parent/Carer Update

We want to make you aware of an increasing issue involving the misuse of social media by some students.

While social media plays a significant role in young people's lives, its misuse can cause real emotional harm and, in some cases, may constitute criminal behaviour under UK law. These behaviours damage relationships, impact wellbeing, and undermine the safe environment we work hard to maintain.

School Response

- If we are able to identify the individuals responsible, the school will take immediate and appropriate action, in line with our behaviour and safeguarding policies.
- Where online accounts cannot be identified, or where the content may break the law, we will refer the matter to
 the police. In previous cases, police have intervened and have been able to trace activity through IP addresses and
 other digital evidence.

How You Can Help

- We ask parents and carers to:
- Speak with your child about their online behaviour and the impact of harmful posts.
- Check privacy settings and which accounts/apps they are using.
- Remind them that online actions have real-world consequences, and that anonymous posting is never truly anonymous.

We appreciate your support in helping us promote respectful, safe and responsible online behaviour. Working together, we can ensure that all students and staff feel protected both in school and online.



SEND REFORM - THE NATIONAL CONVERSATION

The Schools White Paper will be published early next year and will set out our proposed reforms to the SEND system. Building on extensive engagement over the past year, the Department for Education has launched a national conversation on SEND reform.



DfE wants to hear views, experiences and insights from as many people as possible in the coming months. The national conversation encourages everyone from parents to those working in schools, colleges and early years to get involved and help build a consensus on what works to help deliver lasting reform. Every voice will help shape the system our children and young people deserve.

This will be followed by a period of formal public consultation and further engagement following publication of the Schools White Paper early next year.


Each of the seven puzzles leads to a word, or in one case a phrase.

- The robber has to find a route through the house. He can't go through the same coloured door twice in a row, and cannot move against any arrows.


